For its swan song, the retro-futuristic timepiece first launched in 2008 looks more beautiful than ever thanks to its electric-green gasket. Three years on, the 349-component engine made by Jean-Marc Wiederrecht is still as exciting: here you get instantaneous jump hour, concentric retrograde minutes, retrograde date, bi-hemisphere moon phase and automatic winding.
